



Navigating the MDS & RAPs: RAI Training for Nursing Facility Staff

Last chance for MDS 2.0 - April 8-9, 2010

How your nursing facility staff completes and uses the MDS 2.0 (Minimum Data Set) and RAPs (Resident Assessment Protocols) can directly impact resident quality of care, survey outcomes, your publicly posted quality measures and your reimbursement. Although MDS 3.0 is on the horizon, it remains critical that your new and existing staff be properly trained on the MDS 2.0 until the switch is made in October 2010, as errors can cost your facility thousands of dollars! This two-day course is the most comprehensive RAI training offered in Oregon, taught by Demi Haffenreffer, a nationally-recognized long-term care consultant and expert in the RAI and MDS.
